





# My pictures from Dorset






















### My first film.

## This is my film photography project
















# Emotions of London Project

A graduate from the University of Leeds (1st class), and MA Wildlife filmmaking masters in partnership with the BBC, she is using her research skills and creative talents to produce cinematic and stylish wildlife documentaries that are entertaining and connect with audiences (from behavioral blue chip series, features, environmental/conservation stories to human - wildlife films). She is knowledgeable about the business and all areas of the industry including field directing (multi-shoot; long lens, GSS, drone, remotes, high speed, macro), shooting/camerawork, lighting, sound, editing, risk assessments, scheduling, grading, mixing, producing and scriptwriting. 









Exploring around the Cotswolds was very interesting as there where so many little villages and town in creeks and forests























Like the scene before this I tried to capture these beautiful rolling hills and how the light gets so orange in the valley. I kept my camera setting the same in this scene to keep everything relatively in focus to give a true scale of the detail.



As I had only been using a drone for the last 24 hours I was still getting used to video settings and different motions, so in this shot a basically shot the drone up in the sky to about 80m above sea level, (being very careful) and tried to capture as much of the peninsula as I could, I had the frame rate quite high to keep the quality smooth and ramped the quality up to 4k for the extra cinematic feeling
